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for planning and leadership of collective worship. Members of the community, including war veterans, were delighted to be part of the moving dedication of a Remembrance Garden. The contribution of the ordained chaplain results in thought-provoking worship, both for worship in BollegeÑgroups and special services in the Halifax Minster. However, these acts of worship happen only occasionally and pupils do not regularly experience the rich variety of Anglican worship traditions. Staff do not usually lead worship beyond their tutor group. Consequently, pupils do not hear the range of perspectives on Christian values and faith.

RE is well regarded by most pupils. They appreciate that lessons are interesting and challenging. This is because the RE curriculum is carefully and collaboratively planned to meet their needs and engage their interests. Expertise in curriculum planning is shared with other Church schools.
